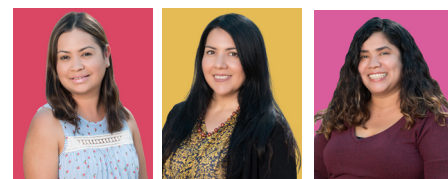

WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH

This year's theme is “Providing Healing, Promoting Hope.” Designated by the National Women's History Alliance, this theme is “both a tribute to the ceaseless work of caregivers and frontline workers during this ongoing pandemic and also a recognition of the thousands of ways that women of all cultures have provided both healing and hope throughout history.” It all began in 1978 in Santa Rosa, California and has gone from a local week-long celebration to national recognition in February 1980 by Jimmy Carter thanks to the efforts led by the National Women's History Project (now the National Women's History Alliance.) It wasn't until 1987 that it was designated as “Women's History Month.”
